

#### **VALE JAN SMITH**



It is with great sadness that we share the news of Jan Smith's passing on 14 May.

Jan joined Mackay Community Theatre in 1960, playing two roles in a faux French farce titled Madame Louise, followed by Johnny Belinda, The Desperate Hours and Pygmalion. Other roles included Norman Thayer Jr in On Golden Pond, Krapp in Krapp's Last Tape, and the Brother in the one-man play The Christian Brothers. His directing skills were demonstrated in *Dear* Delinquent; A Streetcar Named Desire; The Diary of Anne Frank; Chicago; Stop the World, I Want To Get Off; Charley's Aunt, and The Fantasticks.

With his wife Lorraine, he directed *The Medium, The Happy Prince*, and *Amahl* and the Night Visitors at the Mackay Conservatorium.

As Director of Mackay Community Theatre he joined with Colin Paull to launch a fund-raising campaign culminating in the purchase of the Shakespeare Street

premises, which was Kucom's home

until December 2011.


Having retired from journalism continued to write, and at the age of 87 books three published had twelve months: The Glass Cricket Ball, Mackie and Jack, and Hitler's Tractor.

The film was nominated for six academy awards, as well as best actor (Hopkins) and best supporting actress (Olivia Colman).

The stage play is now coming to Kucom Theatre in Mackay for a two-week season in September, and director Victor Scott is looking for a cast that will do

justice to this intriguing and challenging piece of theatre. Scott, whose directing credits for Kucom include When the Rain Stops Falling (2021) and Things I Know To Be True (2023), will be holding auditions for The Father in the Kucom Theatre foyer on Sunday I June, starting at 2pm.
